

# Multi-Day Trips on the Grand Ronde

## Itinerary

*We will meet you at the Minam Store at 10:00 AM on the first morning of your trip. There is no service at Minam, so please have your directions ready before leaving La Grande. Once on the river, you and your guides will spend the next two and a half days fishing for rainbow trout, interrupted only for a couple of lunch breaks and evenings at river camp (about a 52 mile scenic float). We will take off the river in Troy, Oregon, on the last day of your trip.*

## Suggested Personal

- Sleeping bag & pillow (we supply cots and pads)*
- Duffle bag (waterproof bags are recommended, but we do have dry bags for guests to use)*
- Rain Coat Warm Coat*
- Sweater (fleece is recommended)*
- Change of clothes*
- Camp shoes*
- Sun hat*
- Small flashlight*
- Personal toiletries Dark polarized sun glasses (consider lighter lens glasses for evening).*
- Sunscreen*
- Camera*
- Beverages/snacks for boat*

## Shuttles

*Drivers will be arranged to bring your car to the take-out site at \$300 per car. We will need to know the number of vehicles that your party needs shuttled well in advance of your trip, so please relay this info to us as soon as possible.*

## Fishing Equipment

*All fishing equipment will be provided by your guides, but many people prefer to bring their own. Waders & boots available upon request.*

- Fly Rod – (8 to 9 feet) single action reel with floating line #4 or #5. Leaders should be 8' to 9' long with 3X or 4X.*
- Flies – We supply all the flies you will need but please feel free to bring your own:*
  - Dry*
    - Large stone fly #4 - #8, yellow & orange through mid-June.*
    - Parachute Adams #12 - #18*
    - Caddis Fly #12 - #18*
  - Nymphs*
    - Stone Fly #6 & #8 – weighted*
    - Hare's Ear or Prince nymph #10, #12, and #14 – weighted.*
- Chest waders of good quality with felt-bottomed boots. Most of your fishing will take place from the boat. Waders/boots will only be used during lunch or camp time.*
